

Gardens by the Bay – January 15, 2017 – Singapore

We had saved a visit to the Gardens by the Bay for a late afternoon and evening visit – when it's cooler.

These gardens have super tree that are different than any we have ever seen before or probably see again. The trees in this grove are 75' to 150' in height.



Just as we have walked in tree canopies in Costa Rica, Australia and other places we took the walk here. Big difference in this walk is you take an elevator to the top rather than steps or ladders.



After walking the skyway and taking in the views we decided to visit the cloud forest. It's the white curvature building in the background to the left of Nancy (above photo).



Lots of flowers and we spent over an hour walking to the top (and using the elevator) and back down.



As you are exiting you pass by a dozen or more wood carved sculptures. Each was unique and fun to view. I believe we identified over a dozen bird species, several mammals and fish in this sculpture.



After a very good Chinese dinner we walked back to the super tree forest to watch the nighttime light show.



The first thing we did upon entering the Gardens was to take a walk through a portion of the heritage gardens. Why am I ending this piece with the beginning – because of the baby. And the baby weighs seven tons yet floats above the grass.
